Early voting is now open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday – Friday until Friday, Jan. 6, 2023. Saturday early voting is available from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Dec. 31 and Jan. 7. Early in-person voting will only be available at the Office of Voter Registration & Elections, 2449 Princess Anne Road, Building 14 at the Virginia Beach Municipal Center.

Voters may request a ballot by mail until 5 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 30. Mail-in ballots can be returned in person to the Registrar's Office by 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 10, 2023, or by mail and be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the Registrar's Office by noon on the Friday after the election.
